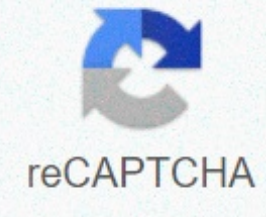

Avast! has built up a solid following based on their philosophy of offering reliable and effective antivirus protection for free home users. In addition to standard antivirus scanning, Avast! offers a variety of resident protection modules that cover various aspects of your computer, such as instant messaging, email, P2P applications, and more. Microsoft Security Essentials (Windows, Free) Microsoft Security Essentials is the latest addition to Microsoft's computer security software. It replaces the Windows Live OneCare subscription service and Windows Defender with more comprehensive coverage than any of the two originally delivered. Microsoft Security Essentials is free for all Windows users and provides protection against a variety of threats, including viruses, malware, adware, and spyware. Avira (Windows, Basic: Free, Premium: \$30 per year) Avira is another antivirus app available for free, although the free version of Avira does not offer as many bells and whistles as some of the other free offers in the current Hive. However, you still get reliable antivirus scanning and protection against malware and rootkits. In addition to the free antivirus software, Avira also offers a Linux Live CD recovery disc loaded with Avira and other free system recovery tools to help you get back on your feet as fighting the virus infection from Windows is just not cutting. ESET NOD32 Antivirus (Windows, \$39.99 per year) NOD32 has built a large level of users over the years by having a low number of false positives and a high percentage of early detection thanks to their community-sourced ThreatSense detection system. As a fun piece American users may know the application as NOD and speak the acronym as an actual word, but the name is actually an acronym that comes from the Eastern European origin of the application. AVG (Windows, Basic: Free, Premium: \$34.99 per year) Avg's free offering is one of the lightest, feature-wise, among the nominations in this Hive Five. That said, if you are looking for a basic antivirus application that will scan your computer, keep an eye out for spyware, and keep you from visiting malware and virus laden websites (via their LinkScanner protection), AVG is a solid free offer. It comes with a host of tools that work in the background to keep you safe and it has consistently scored exceptionally well against its competitors for identifying problems and knocking them down. On the anti-virus side, Bitdefender sniffs out potential threats and keeps an updated list of potential threats to limit your chances of being targeted. The 2020 version of Bitdefender Antivirus Plus has also added Advanced Threat Defense, which is a behavioral detection capability to monitor active apps. And the multi-layered ransomware protection is best-of-class. In addition, the Bitdefender team is available 24/7 for support to help you get through malware-related issues. And because it comes with Bitdefender VPN and Bitdefender Safepay in the box, you will be able to maintain your privacy and protect yourself from financial threats with ease. Bitdefender plus supports up to three devices and is available for Windows 10, 8.1, 8, and Windows 7(SP1). Unfortunately, it doesn't support macOS, Android or iOS, but other versions of the Bitdefender product are available for devices running these platforms. Avast is one of the best known names in antivirus protection, and with good reason. The Avast Free Antivirus application is a full-service antivirus that protects users from viruses, malware, trojans and other types of attacks. The application is also causing little to no system drag, and it contains several features that you won't find in other free antivirus applications. One of the most beautiful features we discovered while testing Avast is the Do Not Disturb mode (formerly Gaming Mode This feature is designed to prevent pop-ups and other interruptions during gaming or streaming, to ensure you don't face distractions at a critical time. Other notable features include the Wi-Fi Inspector who scans Wi-Fi networks for malicious activities, which is an addition to the behavioral scan that Avast uses to detect potentially suspicious behavior from installed applications, and browser extensions that alert you if you type a URL wrong or end up on a malicious site while browsing. Avast is available for Windows 10, 8.1, 8, 7 (SP1 or later) Vista and XP (SP3 or later); macOS 10.10 (Yosemite) or higher, and Android 4.1 (Jelly Bean, API 16) or higher. The antivirus application also has a super easy-to-navigate interface, making it a breeze to check. Microsoft Windows Defender Security Center is pre-installed on Windows 8.1 and Windows 10, but unlike previous versions of Windows Defender, the latest version of the security software is fully equipped and robust like many other free offers on the market. Microsoft Windows Defender provides real-time definition-based antivirus protection for viruses, malware, trojans, ransomware, and other threats, but it also monitors behavioral changes on your system to eradicate potential malware threats early. In addition, Windows Defender includes a firewall to protect your system, parental controls and scanning for USB drives, external hard drives, and drives. The only downfall for Windows Defender is the frequency with which it captures false positives. Windows Defender is known to label JavaScript and other programming code as malicious, when in fact, it's not only benign, but it belongs in the system, so users may want to be careful before deleting files marked as malicious. If you're looking for something simple to use to improve your computer security, F-Secure SAFE is a good place to start. The application has a user-friendly interface and can be essentially self-sufficient (if that's your preference) once it's set up. F-Secure scans your machine for everything from viruses to spyware and completes automatic updates behind the scenes to keep you up to date with the latest threats without having to be too involved. The software automatically removes the malware, of course, and according to the company, will perform all its functions without slowing down your machine. This includes automatic security when you land on a payment page and a family security system that allows you to record multiple devices - 3, 5, or 7, depending on the plan you choose - and set parental controls on your parenting style. F-Secure SAFE is also available for a variety of devices, including: Windows 7 (SP1) or later, macOS 10.12 (Sierra) higher, iOS 11 or higher, and Android 5.0 or higher. Unfortunately, arm-based tablets are not currently supported for F-Secure SAFE. The software constantly scans your machine for potential threats and it works to prevent ransomware threats by identifying problems and responding accordingly. In addition to this, the Total Security offering includes great parental controls, password management, webcam protection, and an excellent firewall. If that's more protection than you think you need, the basic version of Kaspersky Anti-Virus is designed for simplicity, so you set to run and let it do its thing in the background without much input in the long run. However, for a minimum price increase, Kaspersky provides total security protection on up to 5 devices and supports Windows 10, 8.7 and 8.1; macOS X 10.12 or later, Android 4.0 or higher, and iOS 10.0 or later. The only pitfall for Kaspersky is that it can consume a high amount of system resources, so be aware that you need at least 1GB of RAM and 1.5GB of storage on a PC or 2GB of RAM and 1.8GB of storage on a mac.
